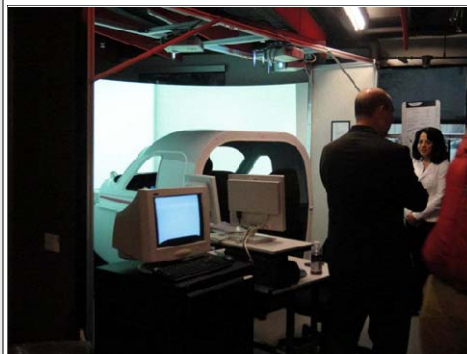

PIREPS? PIREPS Anyone?

I once had a fighter pilot describe the runway breaking action as, “Slicker than snot.” This is a descriptive picture for sure, but just how does one report that? By the way, there’s nothing like seeing an F-4 fishtail around on a ramp like a bottle rocket that can’t get out of its own way. There are those times when it’s nice to know what you’re getting into—or onto—before becoming neck deep in a situation.

Air traffic control towers and airport personnel work closely together to determine and disseminate current weather and airport conditions. Still, there is nothing like having someone “up there” to get the best and most accurate reports. This is where pilot reports (PIREP) come in. Winter conditions can change rapidly and PIREPs are a valuable reporting tool.

Information is useless to others when not shared. Pilots are urged to share any conditions with towers that could affect other arriving or departing aircraft. It is important to note that pilots may initiate PIREP information to ATC concerning weather or airport/runway conditions. Indeed, ATC does solicit PIREPs under various conditions, but a pilot need not wait for this solicitation—especially when conditions have changed from the last PIREP, weather or condition report.

The accuracy of PIREP information begins to deteriorate the moment it is passed. Pilots who receive PIREPs or surface conditions should feel at liberty to pass along a new PIREP *regardless* of whether the conditions have become worse, better, or even remain the same. Every new PIREP resets the clock. For example, conditions may not have changed over the course of one hour, but who trusts old information?

All of these “fresh” reports help other pilots to make informed decisions. Quite often, the condition that is most ignored is improved conditions. Nonetheless, these are essential and necessary. A pilot may base a divert decision on available PIREP information.

How should a pilot report surface conditions? Normally, this information is passed along in the form of a breaking action report. Pilots should make breaking action reports using one of these terms: Good, Fair, Poor, and Nil. Granted, breaking action reports are subjective and often determined by the speed, weight, performance, and configuration of the aircraft. This is why breaking action reports are issued with the aircraft type included.

Lastly, reporting some weather conditions may be obvious, but the more seasonal conditions that should be reported include ceiling and visibility, icing, and wind shear. Be detailed in reports, such as with altitudes (above ground level or sea level), exact location of the occurrence, and description of the condition (trace, light, moderate or severe rime, clear, or mixed icing, etc.).

See you in the pattern—taking down PIREPs.
